September, or any time, would be a great time to review our Emergency Contact information on the ERC website and update the copies we have distributed to family members, our priesthood leaders, and other ERC operators. To update your Emergency Contact Sheet, login to the ERC website. Click on "Update Profile" at the very top of the page. Then click on "Edit my emergency contact sheet". Make your changes and don't forget to click the "Update" button at the bottom of the page to save your changes.
